The Center is pleased to announce its 2018 international artist exchanges and residency fellowships:

City of Salzburg/Anderson Center Artist Fellowship

Minneapolis book artist and printmaker Cathy Ryan will be in residence in Salzburg, Austria, throughout July. A past resident of the Anderson Center, Cathy is a longstanding member of the Minnesota Center for the Book Arts and is the recipient of numerous honors and awards. Her work has been exhibited both nationally and internationally and is included in many public and private collections.

The city of Salzburg, Austria, has awarded painter Katharina Zlobl a one-month residency in July at the Anderson Center. Born in Radstadt near Salzburg and raised in the mountainous village of Neukirchen, she studied psychology and history, and is currently studying art at the International Summer Academy in Salzburg.

Quzhou/Anderson Center Artist Exchange

As part of the Anderson Center/Sister Cities Artist Exchange Program, photographer Chap Achen will travel to Quzhou, China, for a month-long residency in September. A longtime resident of Red Wing, Chap devotes much of his work to images of Midwestern landscapes in and around the Mississippi River valley.

In turn, painter Pan Yu will be in residence at the Anderson Center during the month of September. Born and raised in Wu Yi, Zhejiang,

Pan Yu was Vice Chair and Secretary General for the Quzhou Arts Association and currently serves as Associate Dean and Assistant Professor at Quzhou's School of Art and Design.

Pacific Lutheran University/Deborah Tall Residency Fellowships

The Ranier Writing Workshop of Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington, annually awards two Deborah Tall Residency Fellowships to enhance the literary careers of its students. Writers Kent Weigle of Okanogan, Washington, and Jo-Anne Berelowitz of San Diego, California will each spend two weeks in residency in May.

University of Minnesota/Gesell Writing Fellowships

Two Gesell Writing Fellowships are awarded annually by the University of Minnesota's Program in Creative Writing. The two 2018 recipients are writers Theodosia Henney and Connor McNamara Stratton, who will be in residence in July.
